Ms. Peggy Duncan Freeman - Honorary Regent of the Philadelphia Winn DAR Chapter was awarded the SAR Daughters of Liberty Medal by GASSAR President Dr. David Ludley. This is the highest Medal awarded by the SAR to a DAR member.

February 1, 2023 - President David Ludley has appointed Compatriot Donald McCarty of the Button Gwinnett Chapter to replace Bruce Maney as the Revolutionary War Patriots & Compatriots Graves Committee Chairman.

The evening's program was "The Battle of Oriskany" – presented by Past Button Gwinnett President, Chapter Color Guard Commander and Historian William "Bill" Palmer. Bill was also the State Militia Commander 2015 & 2016 and the State Color Guard Commander 2017 to 2022.

On August 6, 1777, British forces under the command of Sir John Johnson engaged American forces under Nicholas Herkimer in the Battle of Oriskany, resulting in one of the few battles of the war where all the participants were North American. In the summer of 1777, British forces under the command of John Burgoyne moved into the Hudson Valley to cut New England from the rest of the Thirteen Colonies. Burgoyne hoped to move through the valley and reach Albany. British Lieutenant Colonel Barry St. Leger was ordered to support this column by attacking Fort Stanwix in the Mohawk Valley.


