Additional Patriots previously verified for Mr. Anderson were born in Ireland and served as privates in key battles in New Jersey and Virginia. This certificate was presented by Georgia State Society SAR President, Dr. David Ludley.

This was the first event with our new SAR 250th Anniversary Flag and I believe the first time our Button Gwinnett SAR Flag has been displayed with All of our Chapter Streamers since before Covid-19.

The June 8th Chapter Meeting Program was titled: "Colonial and Revolutionary Art and Related Works" by GASSAR President Dr David Ludley

Born in Iowa, President Ludley has 3 children and 6 grandchildren. He is also much involved in Masonry, Church Council, and painting. He went to college in San Jose, California, and in Illinois, where he received his M.A. He became an administrator at Triton College in River Grove, Illinois: Coordinator and Supervisor of Adult Basic Education, English as a Second Language, and GED Review-as well as continuing to teach a few classes, since he loved to teach.

He was hired in 1976 to teach full time at Clayton Jr. College in Morrow, Georgia--where he stayed for 36 years, as the college evolved into Clayton State University, and he attained the top rank of Professor Emeritus of Art History and English.

During that time, Dr. Ludley earned his Ph.D. at Emory University, and was often a featured speaker at the High Museum of Art and several other venues, including many conferences, the Georgia Pacific Auditorium and even Chick-fil-A Corporate Headquarters, in Atlanta.

He was admitted into the National and Georgia Societies of the SAR on June 23, 2010, with the assistance of past President General Larry Guzy, of course. Within the Captain John Collins Chapter, he served as Historian, Vice President, and President, once painting a portrait of George Washington and auctioning it off, to raise money for the chapter. He later became a full member of his local chapter, Marquis de Lafayette, retaining a dual membership with Captain John Collins. He served as GA. Society State Historian for several years, performing other services as well, such as designing the fund-raising Medal and Pin for the 2022 National Congress in Savannah, and serving on many committees. In 2021, he was chosen by the GASSAR Nominating Committee to be the next Senior Vice President, serving actively in this position, traveling across the state, until the sad passing of our President Vancura.

He then became State President. President Joe Vancura was a dynamic, successful leader, who cared deeply for the SAR and for those around him. To ready Dr. Ludley for the eventual presidency, Joe even met every other week on Zoom with him, one-on-one, to involve him fully in all aspects of the National and Georgia SAR innerworkings and projects. Dr. Ludley feels very indebted to President Vancura, who was both a close friend and a mentor.

Ray W. Anderson

Ray was born May 24, 1929 in Clay County, NC. He attended public schools in Clay County. With the consent of his parents, he enlisted in the Regular Army at 17 years of age. He was sent to Fort McCellan, Alabama, for Basic Training. Upon completion, he was assigned to the 25th Infantry Division, 27th Infantry Regiment in Osaka, Japan.

For six months, he took extended Infantry Training in light artillery. His next assignment was to the Military Police. He spent his last assignment in Personnel Administrative maintenance of 300 Military records of servicemen. All these records were maintained manually. He obtained the rank of Staff Sergeant. His assignment was completed and he was honorably discharged in August 1949.

Ray used his GI Bill to attend Young Harris College for 2 years, then graduated from Western Carolina University with a degree in Business Administration.

After graduation from college, he held positions in Credit Management and Sales for GE, BP Oil and for 20 years as SE Regional Credit Manager for Lennox Heating and Air.

After retirement, Ray developed an interest in Genealogy. With the help and encouragement of Bruce Maney, he found his first Patriot, James Anderson, Sr., New Jersey. On March 20, 2008, Ray was admitted into the Button Gwinnett SAR chapter where he held the office of Sergeant of Arms for several years. He was also a member of the Color Guard. Ray received his first Supplement under Martin Maney, VA (which makes Ray a distant cousin to Bruce Maney). Ray's 2nd Supplement was under Private Hugh Rogers, NC. Ray is also a member of The Society of the Descendants of Washington's Army at Valley Forge.







Ray now resides in Dekalb County with his wife, Jeanie. They have been married 68 years and have 2 daughters and 4 grandchildren.

Glider Training

Ray's most exciting assignment was a temporary 3 weeks with the 11th Airborne Division in Sendai, Japan. It consisted of learning techniques in preparing equipment for flight to delivery in a combat war zone lifted by C4 aircraft. Ray stated: "When the school was completed, I was awarded a silver Glider Badge, a Medal that I was very proud to receive!"



General Douglas MacArthur

"I was still in Japan when The General of the Army's Far East command, General Douglas McArthur, was in Tokyo to meet with other Commanders concerning the sentencing of "Tojo", the Japanese top war criminal. (See photo). At a later date, I waited 2 hours in order to get to salute General McArthur. It was worth it and was a highlight of my Military career."





Emperor Hirohito

"The Japanese Emperor visited the 25th Infantry Division residential Barracks. His party was led by our Capt. West, my former MP Commander. The Emperor made no visit to any other US Military Establishment. This was a very memorable occasion for a young 18-year-old." (photo on right)



Daniel & Rebecca Boone Grave Marking

On June 4, 2023, Button Gwinnett 1st VP Ray Kyle attended the Grave Markings of Daniel and Rebecca Boone, at Frankfort Cemetery, Frankfort, KY. Ray was dressed in his militia uniform and presented the Button Gwinnett wreath and participated in the 16-member musket salute. Total mileage was 868 and hours in uniform were 4.

This was a very well-organized and presented event, on a beautiful, albeit quite hot afternoon. There were around 65 Color Guard members in attendance, from multiple states. Approximately 20 Boone family descendants were present. Awesome day!


Daniel Boome (1734-1820), the optiome of the rugged fromnersman who explored and sended the land that became Kenmeky, has achieved oear mystic status in the two centuries since his death. Boone rightly deserver a place in the passitions of great American explorers and pioneers. From 1767 through the early 1770s he and his companions explored wrist of the Alleghers Mouranias. His efforts in building the Wilderness Road in 1775 helped open the way to future serdements in Kennocky. He established the sentences of Boonesbornugh, one of the fires serdements west of the thoumans. In 1756 Boonesbornugh, one of the fires serdements west of the thoumans. In 1756 Boone married Reberca Beyant. The comple had not children. He served in the French & Indian War as a wagon driver in British General Echeani Beadock's ill-firmel expedition against the French and their American Indian alies. In August 1781, during the American Revolution, Boone and the Kentucky Mileia were annianded at Bhut Licks by the British and American Indians. Boone escaped, but his soo Israel was tilled.

Blackfish, a Shavinee Chief, adopted Boone as his soos. 


Opening Ceremonies for the 132nd Continental Congress, Daughters of the American Revolution in Washington DC.



This Memorial captures that moment in time at 9:37 a.m. when 184 lives became intertwined for eternity. Each victim's age and location at the time of the attack have been permanently inscribed into the Memorial by the unique placement and direction of each of the 184 Memorial Units. This was part of a personal tour conducted by Tom's cousin Jeff Jacques.





Three generations of one family join the sons of the American Revolution together

Five members of a local family re-cently did something that is pret-ty rare for a chapter of the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution. They joined the group at the same time. The members of the Stoecker fam-

ily — including John Stoecker, his two sons and two grandsons — represent three generations. Georgia State So-ciety SAR President David Ludley inducted the family members into the organization's Button Gwinnett chapter on June B.

"Although it is not uncommon to induct new members, it is very unusual for five members from one family to join together," Button Gwinnett chap-ter officials said. "This iess a Christmas present from patriarch John Stoecker to himself, his two sons, and his two

But, the five Stoeckers are actually not the first members of their family to join the group. John Stoecker's father joined the Children of the Ameri-can Revolution, a younger version of the Sons of the American Revolution, when he was 8 in 1923 and went on to become a a member of the adult eroup later on in life.

Thomas Helm, who served as a lieu-tenant under Col. Thomas Marshall in the 3rd Virginia Regiment in Capt. Philip Francis Lee's Company during the Revolutionary War. The meeting where the Stoeckers

were inducted was also significant for a World War II veteran. Ray William Anderson, 94, was given a supplemental certificate recognizing his Revolutionary War ancestor, Hugh Rogers, who served as a soldier in the North Carolina Continental Line, Anderson was already a member through other ancestors who served during the Revolutionary War.
