Information on U.S. Army retired Sergeant Major Sarita Dyer

Sarita Dyer of Georgia is a highly regarded military leader, known for her exceptional contributions and achievements throughout her career. As a Sergeant Major, Sarita has served in a multitude of leadership roles, including her time as the Officer in Charge of the Female Engagement Team during Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF) in 2013. Her illustrious career is decorated with numerous prestigious awards, such as the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star (2), Meritorious Service Medal (4), Army Commendation Medal (6), Army Achievement Award Medal (11), Afghanistan Campaign Medal, Iraq Campaign Medal with star, and many others. Her service was not only about duty but a commitment to excellence in every position she held, from Force Protection Sergeant Major to her leadership role in the 3rd Infantry Division as the Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear (CBRN) Senior Advisor. In 2022, Sarita Dyer, was inducted into the Georgia Military Veteran Hall of Fame.





Michael Henderson - Past Button Gwinnett Chapter President Facebook Post Sep 26, 2025

On September 19 and 20, 2025, I attended a symposium titled "Spain and the Birth of American Democracy II: America & Spain 250," held at the Daughters of the American Revolution National Headquarters Constitution Hall. My sister Jane Bronner, a member of the Atlanta Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR), was also in attendance at this symposium. As a Past-President of the Button Gwinnett Chapter, Georgia Society, Sons of the American Revolution (SAR), what made our attendance a little more personal and historic was a significant moment that served as a capstone for this already momentous occasion.

When everyone in the room stood and fell silent as Queen Sofia began her exit at the conclusion of the symposium, Jane was moved in that moment to pay homage to the Spanish Crown and extend our family's appreciation for Spain's part in our ancestors' story of freedom.

The backstory of the video below is that 246 years ago, our fourth-generation great-grandmother, Agnes Mathieu, an enslaved woman born in French Colonial Louisiana, gained her freedom on December 16, 1779, less than ninety days after the victory at The Battle of Baton Rouge on Sept 21, 1779. (A fitting tribute to this year's America 250 Louisiana commemorations.)

Upon his return from the battlefield to New Orleans, Spanish Colonial Governor of Louisiana, Bernardo de Galvez, signed Agnes's freedom papers. This act, after a year-long contentious court battle, forever solidified the liberation from enslavement of that line of our family. Now you see why Jane was so grateful and why her majesty, Queen Sofia, was so appreciative of Jane's moving words.

If you are planning to attend – We need to know of your participation AT LEAST TEN DAY in ADVANCE

Presenting the colors at the Sunbelt Ag Expo in October will certainly be a feather in our tricorns. The luncheon begins at noon so we need to be on site no later than 11:00.

Guardsmen need to allow extra time as traffic is usually congested at Spence Field, site of the Expo. Since most of the guardsmen live north of Columbus and Macon, they may want to come the night before. If so, they need to make arrangements as soon as possible as lodging is at a premium for miles around during Expo. There are only two hotels in Moultrie that I would recommend, Hampton and Holiday Inn Express. There are quite a few hotels in Tifton which is 30 miles north. They need to make a reservation as soon as possible.

Thomas Colemen needs to let Expo know how many passes we need 10 days in advance (which would be Oct. 4, 2025)

If the guardsmen have never attended Expo, they may want to spend the afternoon walking the grounds of North America's premiere farm show. The Expo includes a 100-acre exhibit area with both indoor and outdoor exhibits adjacent to a 530-acre working research farm. Exhibits also include lawn and garden, hunting, fishing and family living. The show is held at Spence Field, site of a World War II Army Airfield training facility. Some remnants of the airfield are still visible. I'm sure they would generate attention as they always do walking through Expo in their Continental attire.
